Chocolate or Stuffed Toy Bunnies and Chicks are Best

Sacramento, CA – Baby chicks and bunnies are very cute and hard to resist as a gift for Easter. However, it's important to do some research before you make the decision to purchase them as a gift. When Easter is over and the cute chick or bunny has turned into a teenager, local shelters are flooded with unwanted rabbits and chickens creating a demand on services.

Here are some important things to know before you make the decision to buy a chick or bunny:

- Chickens live from five to ten years
- They need a proper habitat, including roosting quarters, specialized feed, vaccinations and veterinary care
- They can destroy your flower and vegetable gardens and your property may not be properly zoned to keep chickens
- Rabbits live as long as seven to ten years and require exercise space indoors and out
- They need socialization, a proper hutch, and veterinary care
- Spay/neutering is recommended to prevent rapid reproduction and certain behavioral issues

Rabbits and chickens are excellent pets for many people, but as with any decision to add a member to your family, research and careful consideration are required.

Some questions to ask before acquiring any animal:

- Can I afford this pet including veterinary care, vaccinations, food, and housing?
- Can I provide for specialized diet and housing needs?
- Am I willing to care for this animal for the rest of its life?
- Can I provide care during travel and vacations?
- Do I have the time to train, socialize, and clean up after this pet?
- Where will my family be in three years or five ...will this animal be a good match?
