Sacramento, CA—Sacramento County and the City of Rancho Cordova are working cooperatively on the Femoyer Street Improvement Project, which will improve traffic circulation in the Mather Commerce Center area and Rancho Cordova. The project includes: construction of a new portion of roadway on Femoyer Street to fill in a gap between International Drive and McCuen Boulevard; widening and improving an existing portion of Femoyer Street between McCuen Boulevard and Mather Boulevard; constructing a new portion of Airpark Drive east of Femoyer Street; new landscaped medians, sidewalks, street lights and drainage facilities. This project continues Sacramento County's long-term efforts and investments in the conversion of military bases to civilian uses. Many infrastructure projects have been completed at McClellan and Mather to connect these facilities to local communities and improve roadways to foster new business development and new investments.
